



Thank you to everyone who came to support FHS at the Town Meeting on March 11. We've received several questions regarding why we chose to postpone our petitioned Warrant Article. We'd like to answer those questions based on what we know and what we've learned since Town Meeting.

The confusion surrounding the article was in reference to the phrase "*percentage of assets*." 24 hours before Town Meeting, we were informed by town officials that we could not proceed with the article as written as it did not specify a specific amount to be transferred, and exactly how that money would be transferred into a Town Expendable Trust. Therefore, we chose to postpone the vote until such time as we can work alongside the town to figure out exactly how (or if) we can go about transferring ownership of the Blake House to the town.

Another important question on everyone's mind was "*How much would a taxpayer pay per year to preserve the Fitzwilliam Museum if the town agreed to acquire the building?*"

The answer would vary by the size of the property you own. However, the cost on average is \$4 for every \$100,000 of assessed value. For example, if your property is assessed at \$400,000, your tax would be approximately \$16/ year to preserve the history of Fitzwilliam.

That said, we want to again thank everyone who has been involved in this petition from the very beginning, and for your continued support of the Fitzwilliam Historical Society. We don't know what the future holds for us, but we can hope that the town sees enough value in our mission to help us continue our work.

Spring is officially here and many of you may be looking forward to another summer season at Laurel Lake. Before the black flies make you crazy, think about some things you can do to help protect the lake. Top priority – before you start having guests – is get your septic pumped if it's been a while. Septic seepage is nasty and unnecessary. And, now that we're coming out of Mud Season, take a look at the signs of drainage and water flow across your property. Are there ruts of dirt heading into the lake or piling up on other parts of your yard? Now is a great time to put in some native plants which can reduce stormwater runoff and beautify your property. Low maintenance, attractive plants include low bush blueberries, ferns, Joe Pie Weed, Buttonbush, Elderberry. You don't need to re-landscape your yard – even one shrub can make a difference.

If you're looking for advice on how to reduce runoff on your yard and what to plant, NH LAKES has a Lake Smart program with great online tools and they can provide a FREE in person consultation. This is a great service which several lake front owners have taken advantage of and you can see the attractive results from the road and lake sides of their properties.

We're happy to say that the kick-off meeting for our Watershed Management Plan was held March 4 and the consultant is being hired to start the evaluation of watershed activity around the lake. This is a long-range program but we are thrilled to have gotten funding to help us (the Association and the Town) identify risks to the lake and develop action plans to address them. TOWN CLERK NEWS

The Local/MRSD Election was held on Tuesday, March 11. The polls opened at 11am with a line of voters waiting to vote. William Pine was the first voter to use the new vote tabulator from VotingWorks. We finished voting with 460 people casting their ballot. It was a very good turnout for a Local Election. We registered 6 new voters. Please remember if registering to vote we now need a birth certificate (and if married/name change since birth a marriage license) or a US passport to complete your registration. The results from the Election are posted in the Town Hall or a located on the Town's website.

We are now licensing dogs for the year 2025. All renewals can be completed online if you like, just remember to add 24- to the license number (example: 24-001 would be the license number for 001). The renewal period is from January 1-April 30. There is the month of May to get your license done without late fees. After May 31 there is a \$1.00 per month late fee and around August 15th I will start the Civil Forfeiture procedure . (Tentatively issuing around Sept. 1). Please license your dog! The end is fast approaching (April 30th).

We are also registering BOATS for 2025. You can renew or do New for 2025 now. We do not offer online renewals for boats. Please bring your prior registration when renewing your boat (vehicles too).




2025 ANNUAL TOWN MEETING



FITZWILLIAM GARDEN CLUB

The Fitzwilliam Garden Club held a program on March 11 presented by District III Director and Master Gardener Dian Mathews. Dian talked about the importance of using non-GMO (genetically modified) seeds and how important it is to be aware of foods that contain bioengineered ingredients. Plants that are grown using GMO seeds have been created using high tech engineering to modify the plant's biology in order to present specific characteristics. It is important to purchase non-GMO seeds from a reliable source and to buy native plants to include in our gardens to benefit pollinators.

On April 30, we will hold a potluck dinner with speaker Amber Dewey who is a member of the Monadnock Beekeepers Association. She will discuss pollinator bees and wasps native to New Hampshire and how we can act to support them as their populations are declining.

In May we plan to visit the Native Plant Trust in Massachusetts during Trillium Week. It will be a good opportunity for members to learn about these plants and purchase some for our own gardens.

Our garden club will hold its spring plant and bake sale on Saturday May 24, 2025 from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM. We will sell perennials from our gardens, some purchased from local nurseries, annuals and baked goods. Check our Facebook page for more details as we get closer to that day.
